


CASEL FRAMEWORK CHART

The CASEL Framework is a made up of 5 abilities we can all develop and improve on. These life skills help us learn about and manage our own emotions and understand and empathise with others, which helps us have better friendships and relationships. Learning to manage ourselves, our relationships and our time helps us have happier, more successful lives.

Self- awareness	The ability to accurately recognise one's own emotions, thoughts and values and how they influence behaviour. The ability to accurately assess one's strengths and limitations with a well-grounded sense of confidence and optimism. Self- management	The ability to successfully regulate one's emotions, thoughts and behaviours in different situations – effectively managing stress, controlling impulses, and motivating oneself. Social awareness	The ability to take the perspective of and empathise with others.
